REQUIRED COURSES

INT201HT: HISTORY AND THEORY OF PUBLIC HUMANITIES

Addresses history, theories, and methodologies of publicly-engaged humanities and considers the role of the public university in advancing democratic values and equipping citizens with the tools necessary to be full participants in society

INT201SP: SKILLS FOR THE PUBLIC SPHERE

Instructs in using academic research tools beyond the university; communicating skillfully with diverse publics; establishing and sustaining relationships with community partners; digital skills; grant writing; budgets; and project management

PRACTICUM

Public humanities internships and fellow-designed community projects provide graduate students paid opportunities to apply their academic training in community settings.

CAPSTONE PROJECT

Fellows present their work in a forum that reaches a broad audience.
