Inspired by his ethnographic work with queer of color users of the platform Tumblr and using the Tumblr presence of Filipinx transfeminine visual and performance artist Mark Aguhar as a recurring touchstone, this work-in-progress talk's provocation is that the assumptive ways in which a social media platform "should" be designed—singular identity, linear text exchanges, direct messaging, traversable connections, and more—in fact instantiate a model of "Man" that can be traced back to the epistemological violences of European colonialism.
