Leah DeVun is Associate Professor of History and Vice Chair for Undergraduate Education at Rutgers University, a multi-media artist, and a curator. DeVun focuses on the history of gender, sexuality, science, and medicine in pre-modern Europe, as well as contemporary queer and transgender studies. DeVun is also the author of *Prophecy, Alchemy, and the End of Time,* winner of the 2013 John Nicholas Brown Prize, and coeditor (with Zeb Tortorici) of *Trans*historicities*, a special issue of *TSQ: Transgender Studies Quarterly* (2018) devoted to transgender history before the advent of current categories and terminologies of gender.
