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How do racialized icons of popular culture index Muslim ideas of history and belonging? Several Arabic epics (*siyar shaʻbiyya*), contain Black protagonists who are assigned unique origin stories and legacies of involvement in Islam's expansion. This talk will analyze their roles in the racial imaginaries of popular tales that proliferated from the 12th century onward across the Middle East and North Africa through oral and written traditions.
